Richard's diary Continued,

Santa Barbara Mon 1<sup>st</sup> July

El Hefor ate Man Plan according to Tessa we could go wrong on the hike and told a story about that actually... Tessa is a Spaniard + dive who was an absolute legend, helping us haul gear up the hill and sorting out the permit to care. Dan Simon is water and oil dyes. Next day lie in and another haul (Ramon did 3) - ~~Wednesday~~ 2<sup>nd</sup> July, I got the dye made ~~Wednesday~~ 2<sup>nd</sup> July. Share and myself took the car down to Cangas de Onís to shop and pick up James who turned out to be from QMB and we both knew a little. Tried to buy things, successfully got £100 of shopping which was mostly 6kg of cheese and 3kg of salami. Also Dan Simon but not enough Vino Tinto. We tried to buy a whiteboard with no knowledge of Spanish in various shops. Shopkeepers went back into the back for a moment and came out with things like chalk, paper, pens etc. The one lady who understood us ("blanca sonido?") didn't have any and suggested the Librería-bookshop, where we went. For a town with so many souvenir shops you might expect a better general understanding of English but perhaps the Gringos only go to warmer parts of Spain on holiday. Eventually while Share was in the Monstar shop for 2 hours I found an Asian cheap cap shop and got whiteboard markers labelled in English, and plastic wallets for the board. Share meanwhile waited for a passionate old lady to shout down the phone and then a couple to buy 2 phones which took 90 minutes. Share then handed over all his cash and assisted by a 7-year-old girl who was the one to speak English in the shop, got a SIM and which cost €22 some how and a Recharge for him internet! Put it in my phone later but I had to disable the APN settings for Monstar which

proxy for web browsing to work. Should be £2 for 1GB card and £3.68 per week for 100MB internet. 3G signal can be obtained atop the hill between refugio and weather station on Montaña and on Orange next to the weather station. While there was in the shop I picked up James, got petrol for the generator and to stop the salsa (trying to put diesel in my car) and got shorted out for parking in a taxi rank (I'd forgotten to sign cream my legs in all this and had nice burns on the outside. It was 28°C in town. Foggy at the car park though, and we found Stephan and Fabio who said he was carrying the van, tonight leaving around 10pm\* and Roman, and went up the hill. I carried about 10L of petrol, my accordion, personal carry gear <sup>more equipment</sup> in a tackle sack strapped to my rucksack, maybe 30-40kg.

Thurs 4th July - First try to enter Xitu with Jones and Roman. Failed all morning as we had to wait for Team Arely, Bain and back to reng entrance series. Walked to the cave in early year I was carrying 2 bags. Pretty exhausted from the sun we headed in and Roman beat first, then Jones then I passed 2 bags to Jones through the tight bit of doorway. SRT kit still on I tried to squeeze through on my left side but fell short of the bulgy bit and landed out. Rinse and repeat. Then Jones suggested trying on my right hand side but I didn't like how that felt, mentally wrecked and a bit physically from 3 days of carrying I decided to turn around and delay climaz for later. Took a lot of effort to get up extreme pitch.

Back at the refugio I was renovated by everyone and forced to try Xitu the next day.

Fri 5<sup>th</sup> July continued - "This where is tight"

Crooked up the last pitch before down at I had a red sense of dread as if I knew something was about to go badly wrong, which is justifiable given my experiences on the previous day but I told myself it would be fine, I got through no problems on the way in.

I hung the bag on the traverse line, put my roll and mauler into gear loop with the descender and fuelled by Decathlon's finest ISO tonic hyperjuice slung myself through the Clonak RGT on my right side. Possibly high from the sugar rush, it seemed that I believed I could fly and this might have got me through the first tight bit but then I came crashing down just before the bulge on the left side. Tried to force myself through and it wasn't happening. So I decided to back out. Very tight. I think it's wider lower down so one foot on the stepple I force myself back. Nope. Slipping down, stop, try and move a bit, slip down some more, eventually come to rest wedged as far down as my fat legs could fit. "NO, NO, NO!"

Eric comes up the pitch and appears around the corner "Help me... please"

"Ok, try to use the stepple to push yourself up" I could just reach it by flailing my left leg up at 45°, and couldn't get any power on it.

Next thing to try was Eric's footloop, which she had tucked in the traverse line and flung towards me. It was in about the same place as that useless stepple. Putting my foot on it just tightened the traverse line around my neck.

Eric looked up. "Ooh, there's a slope in the ceiling. Why the heck did no one tell us that was there? I'll put my footloop around it!"

Footloop was the wrong length but I had a 240cm

slings over one shoulder. I wiggle for 5 minutes to free it without dropping my knife, whistle and spinner which were clipped onto it. Eni grabs the sling and puts it around the sternum so there's a thing allowing me to pull myself out, moe and solid.

Grab it with my left hand and pull with all my strength. That's enough to lift my bodyweight but oh no I'm not north, I'm wedged in good. How the hell did I get in here anyway? (Oh yeah, 90 kgs of gravitational force)

I fling my head around to look back towards the cave exit, and my light goes out. Oh shit. I'd actually just knocked the Smith on the Dog, and I could even reach it to turn it back on. Fuck over. Ok, maybe there's a way through at a low level this way.

Eni: Can you see the line?

Me: Yes I can, see the traces. Do you mean the way through? No not really.

There was a bit of a foothold just above my right foot so I tried to use that and give myself hugeamps in my right leg. Still no progress but I then realized I had centimetres of space in front of my D-mallot so might be able to reverse my SRT kick.

This felt like it took hours and I still couldn't get R leg legs off but got the gear away from my waist. With foothold and slings I managed to get up with little difficulty now. Sit on stomp previously cut the pitch, panting, eating, drinking more hypoglycemic.

Eni had another genius idea - use bag as bangle - so I get through no problem this time. Except I was the wrong side of trunze the and tapped. Had to reverse a bit and sort things out.

Ah, and if you are looking for a Hostel in Cangas del Onis, this is where you find it:



9/4 reinvestigated, first pitch re-rigged with two spits. Left-hand route finished according to shaft bushing guide so not descended this time. Right-hand shaft descended and climb lead mentioned in the guide climbed. Climb leads to an aven which is blind.

Down loose slope leads round corner to a high aven which was partially climbed but did not look promising.

Low archway on left draughts strongly, passed to rubble floored passage. Some digging found another arch which ~~also~~ is the source of the draught. Much more digging would be necessary and the dig is possibly trend back towards the left-hand pitch.

Another lead exists as a rift ~2m down the right-hand (8m) pitch. v-tight but could easily be widened by hammering and a widening p is visible both beyond.

## EL PURITAN NOTES FROM 2013

- boulder slope up to the R in EP.
- large wedged boulder - long wire
- 15m climb - one bolt + one natural (but rub)
- large chamber, short steep climb to left.
- old coin - limit of 1981.
- 3 ways or ① pitch to stream - head back to camp.  
② traverse to v. bold step. - large passage.  
③ perilous traverse to small chamber + slot, rift to another chamber - possibly links back in near camp.

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Rowan - 6TH TO 11TH

WENT IN with BRANT & JAMES Sunday evening with several bags. Collected more bags 11 in total and transported to top of flat iron which AYELT + GELAN were still rigging. Left bags and came out to bed. Out by 04:00.

7th: Slept 0400 to 0800 then continued the objective of setting up camp with SHANE, HELENA, SANDY. Got camp set up by 2130 and we slept until 0200 when the rigging team returned from PYTHAGORAS. Came to SISUORE at lunch time. Wasn't allowed to go back underground so did atmospheric pressure then layed out bed.

8th - Objective: Final setup second camp with GELAN + BRANT

late start with gear loss so went to camp 1 and ate raisins then slept over some raisins + deer meat.

9th: 10:45 - left camp, rigged an from cross chalk to chunder pot, carried bags to top of chunder. Successful trip. returned to camp at 0100 for more raisins + flapjacks.

10th left camp and came out gave GELAN foot former then blozed out. nice to not stop. normal/dried gear ready to go in on 12th.
